The Qur'an, while making no allusions of being a scientific text, speaks of the environment. It contains a code of eco-spiritual ethics. The Qur'an declares that Allah/God leads all of creation A towards "*rushd*" or spiritual maturity. It does so by establishing a close relationship between natural phenomenon (signs of God), God, and humanity. This talk will examine this phenomenon by drawing directly from the Qur'an in a language that will easy for non-Arabic speakers to understand.
