She has been a full professor in the Divinity School at the University of Chicago since 1978 and is the author of many translations of Sanskrit texts as well as books about Hindu mythology and cross-cultural mythology, particularly about illusion, animals, gender, and sex, most recently *The Bedtrick: Tales of Sex and Masquerade*, *The Woman Who Pretended to Be Who She Was*, and *The Hindus: An Alternative History*. She is Mircea Eliade Distinguished Service Professor of the History of Religions in the University of Chicago Divinity School; she also serves in the Department of South Asian Languages and Civilizations and the Committee on Social Thought.*
