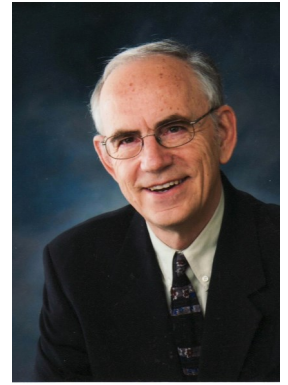


Toward a Theology and Pedagogy of Active Hope: Lessons from My Parents
